### Professional Summary

My primary research areas are in ethics (especially biomedical ethics), social philosophy, and philosophy of economics. My research is practically-oriented and interdisciplinary, and addresses contemporary social and policy issues with tools from philosophy, economics, game theory, and biology. I have published on topics including reproductive technologies, vaccination clinical trials, and vaccination policy, as well as more theoretically-oriented work on foundational issues in economics and rational choice in top ranked academic journals. I have also disseminated my work in public-oriented online and magazine venues. I have authored 15 publications total, including: 7 international peer-reviewed journal articles (5 as first author); two book chapters (1 as first author); and 6 online & magazine publications.

I have a particular interest and demonstrated excellence in teaching. Over the last 5 years I have taught more than 30 courses and over 1500 students. I have designed the curriculum for and been responsible for all aspects of teaching and examining undergraduate courses in ethics, social & political philosophy, biomedical ethics, metaphysics and epistemology, and critical thinking. I have a record of excellent student as well as peer-review evaluations of my teaching. I have experience teaching both problems-based and historically-oriented courses in philosophy. I have also team-taught and developed interdisciplinary graduate courses on specialty topics at the intersection of ethics, philosophy of mind, philosophy of biology, social/political philosophy, economics, and evolutionary biology.
